Mr. Van W. Noah, P.E., joined the Institute for Defense and Business (IDB) as a Program Director in the fall of 2005. He graduated from the LOGTECH MBA (now known as IU-IDB MBA) as a private sector participant in 2004 and now leads a team that manages that program, the LOGTECH Advanced Course, and the Life Cycle Executive Leadership Program for the Institute of Defense and Business. He continues to help develop new and innovative education programs for the IDB's clients.

Van came to the IDB from an engineering and management career with the Michael Baker Corporation managing the North Carolina offices of the corporation responsible for building the FedEx Mid-Atlantic hub in Greensboro and expanding operations in the state. Prior to joining Michael Baker

After the Engineer Officer Advanced Course, he reported to the 307th Engineer Battalion (Airborne) in the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, where he served in various staff positions including Assistant Division Engineer before obtaining his second company command. Following Command and Service Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, he served as a Brigade Engineer for the 501st Military Intelligence Brigade in Seoul, Korea. He left the military for a civilian career in 1992 as a Major.

Van has a Bachelor's in Science in Civil Engineering from the Virginia Military Institute and a Master's in Business Administration from Indiana University's Kelley School of Business with a LOGTECH MBA Certificate from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's Kenan-Flagler Business School. He is also a registered Professional Engineer.
