Zebrina has been with the IDB since 2003. As a Program Director, she oversees both UNC-IDB Strategic Studies Fellows Program and IU-IDB Strategic Studies Fellows Programs.

In 2012, she led the IDB team to create and develop the UNC-IDB Strategic Studies Fellows Program (UNC-IDB SSFP), the organization's first multi-week in-residence graduate-level program focused on National Security and Decision Making and developing executive skills. The UNC-IDB SSFP program was the U.S. Army's first strategic broadening seminar for Army Captains and has now expanded to include Majors, Chief Warrant Officers, Senior Non-Commissioned Officers, and Army Civilians.

Subsequently in 2016, Zebrina worked closely with Indiana University's School of Global and International Studies and Kelley School of Business to create a three-week IU-IDB Strategic Studies Fellows Program focused on National Security, Cybersecurity, Global Flashpoints, and Leader Development.

More recently in 2017, Zebrina created the IDB Dense Urban Areas Program (DUA), which takes place in New York City, focused on educating the U.S. Army and U.S. Marine Corps on the infrastructures, challenges during times of crises, and interagency operations - all within megacities.

All three programs are part of the U.S. Army's portfolio of strategic broadening seminars and they help the military's future leaders to think strategically and critically about National Security issues at a much earlier point in their careers.

Zebrina is also an internationally recognized Authentic Leadership Coach, who works with students and participants on a regular basis. Her passion is watching people grow and become better versions of themselves. In addition, Zebrina manages the IDB Executive Fellows Program, which annually inducts five retired senior-ranked military and civilian members all of whom teach in the IDB programs.

Zebrina completed her IU-IDB MBA from the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University and an MS in Strategic Management from the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University. She graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in with BA from the School of Journalism.
