## Program Format

LOG21 is taught workshop-style using a combination of lectures, guest speakers, panels, and in-class exercises.

### SAMPLE SESSION TOPICS INCLUDE:

- Technology, Innovation, and the Logistics Enterprise

### SMALL GROUP PROJECTS

When registering for the LOG21 program, participants are asked to share a concise summary of one key logistics challenge at play in their work environment. These statements are compiled, reviewed by faculty, and participants are placed into small groups with peers who outline similar challenges.

Throughout the week, participants meet with their small group to apply what they learn in program sessions to their shared challenges. At the end of the week, participants present their group's findings to a panel of senior logistics leaders who share their feedback and input with the class.
